What is ERASMUS MUNDUS Programme?

Erasmus Mundus is a cooperation and mobility programme in the field of higher education that aims to enhance the quality of higher education and to promote dialogue and understanding between people and cultures through cooperation between Europe and Third-Countries.

The programme is implemented by the Education, Audiovisual and Culture Executive Agency (EACEA). This cooperation is materialized through comprehensive grant programme to implement the mobility of students and staff from South America to EU and vice-versa.

ERASMUS MUNDUS SUD-UE Programme

SUD-UE Erasmus Mundus (EMA2 - STRAND1, Lot 14) is a partnership established between 12 South American Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) in ten targeted countries (Argentina, Bolivia, Brazil, Chile, Colombia, Ecuador, Paraguay, Peru, Uruguay and Venezuela) and 8 European HEIs from 7 different countries (France, Germany, Ireland, Italy, Portugal, Slovenia and Spain) within the framework of the Erasmus Mundus Action 2.

The types of mobility are:

- Undergraduate
- Master
- Doctorate
- Post-doctorate
- Academic and administrative staff

Coverage of the mobility grant

- **Monthly subsistence allowance** which depends on the type of mobility:

From South America to EU

| Type of individual mobility | Period of mobility |

| Undergraduate | From 1 academic semester to 10 months |
| Master | From 1 academic semester to 24 months |
| Sandwich Doctorate | From 6 to 10 months |
| Full Doctorate | 36 months |
| Post-Doctorate | From 6 to 10 months |
| Academic and administrative staff | 1 month |

From EU to South America

| Type of individual mobility | Period of mobility |

| Undergraduate | 6 months |
| Master | 6 months |
| Sandwich Doctorate | 6 months |
| Full Doctorate | 6 months |
| Post-Doctorate | 6 months |
| Academic and administrative staff | 1 month |

Who can participate?

To be an eligible candidate the applicant must:

For South American students and staff:

1. Be a **NATIONAL** of one of the third-countries
2. Belong to Target Group 1, 2 or 3 (see Target Groups description)
3. Have **NOT RESIDED NOR HAVE CARRIED OUT THEIR MAIN ACTIVITY** (studies, work, etc) **FOR MORE THAN A TOTAL OF 12 MONTHS OVER THE LAST FIVE YEARS** in any of the eligible European countries at the time of submitting their application to the partnership. (This rule does not apply to Target Group 3 candidates).
4. **Prove the level** required by Host University

For European students and staff:

1. Be a **NATIONAL** of the European Union
2. Belong to Target Group 1
3. Have sufficient knowledge of the language of the courses or of one of the languages currently spoken in the hosting countries
4. **Prove the language level** required by Host University
